Sikh	Someone who follows Sikhism. They follow one God and believe in one God and the equality of all people.
Baisakhi Festival	Founding of the Khalsa in 1699. It is a time of celebration and time as a community.
Diwali	Celebrates the release of the sixth Guru, Guru Hargobind, in 1619.
Guru	Teacher or leader of the Sikh religion.
Langer Meal	Community kitchen which serves free meals to all regardless of religion or gender.
Turban	Long piece of fabric worn on the head covering their uncut hair.
Khanda	The symbol of Sikhism. It contains a ring of steel and swords crossing over each other.
